

2014 Marathon Nationals Course Map & Course Description

All races will start and finish the Manitoba Canoe and Kayak Center, located at 80 Churchill Dr. Tel: 204 284-4646.

The course is on the Red and Assiniboine Rivers through the heart of Winnipeg. Water depths are generally over six feet. There is no danger of damage to boats on any section of the course, but competitors should take care to avoid paddle damage in the extreme shallows. These areas will be marked with yellow caution buoys. All races will start with an upstream sprint for 500m then turn downstream towards the Provencher Bridge, turning after the bridge and going upstream to the Osborne bridge on the Assiniboine, then turning again and back to the Club.

2014 Marathon Nationals Competition Rules

Rules of Structure: www.canoekayakcanada.ca/ click on "marathon"

Start

The start will be "one minute to start" followed by the blow horn at any time following the one minute warning.

False Starts

Two false starts by the same team shall constitute immediate disqualification.

Competitors

Only those competitors registered in the competition may be on the race course during the event

Portages

Under no circumstances may a portage be used with the effect of shortening the course of the race.

Assistance

No competitors shall be assisted in any way in carrying his/her canoe or paddle over a portage. In the event of a capsize, a competitor may receive assistance with emptying his/her craft and regaining his/her paddling position, but may not be progressed in any way.

PFD's

Personal Flotation Devices (PFD's) must be in the boat. It is not required that the competitors wear their lifejackets, with the exceptions of competitors under the age of 14 years must wear a Ministry of Transport approved lifejacket. Inflatable PFD's are acceptable.

Overtaking

Where a competitor is overtaking another competitor, it is the duty of the person overtaking to keep clear at all times of the craft being overtaken.

Age

Proof of age may be requested. Acceptable identification will be a driver's license and/or a birth certificate.

Who can compete?

Canadian residents must be members in good standing with a recognised provincial canoe racing association. Non-Canadian residents are required to pay a non-resident membership fee of \$10 (Can funds). All competitors must pay a registration fee to the Canoe Kayak Canada Marathon Council in order to compete

Age Categories & Watercraft specifications

Midget - under 16 years January 1, the year of competition
Junior - under 18 years January 1, the year of competition
Senior - over 18 years January 1, the year of competition
Master Men 1 - 40 years or older January 1, the year of competition
Master Men 2 - 50 years or older January 1, the year of competition
Master Men 3 - 60 years or older January 1, the year of competition
Master Women 1 - 40 years or older January 1, the year of competition
Master Women 2 - 50 years or older January 1, the year of competition
Master Women 3 - 60 years or older January 1, the year of competition

Midget, and junior class participants must be of the age of the class for which they qualify - there will be no age averaging. All youth participants may move up in age categories and will register under the older category. No youth participants may move down in age categories. Youth may be allowed to compete in the adult category and will be recognized as Senior. Age averaging will be allowed for all Masters Categories. Seniors may not age average. If a team is mixed with a Senior athlete that team is then recognized as Senior. An adult cannot go down to youth category.

Watercraft Specifications

Recreational Class Canoe: This is a non expert class (up to officials discretion)

Clipper Trippers will be used (supplied by Western Canoeing & other) or you can bring your own.

17'Jensen Class: Jensen designed canoe, recently adopted as a class

at National Championships, built by Western Canoeing

and Wenona. (used at N.A.I.G. Games)

Marathon C-1 Class Canoe: up to 18'6" in length with a minimum of

32" at amidships at 4" waterline. Adopted

from U.S.C.A. rules of competition

Marathon C-2 Class Canoe: up to 18'6" in length with a minimum of

27" at amidships at 3" waterline.
